




Dog Grooming Certification Pros and Cons


So you want to take the plunge and become a certified dog groomer, congratulations!

What does it mean to be "Certified"?


In general, dog grooming is an unregulated industry. In many regions, you don't need to have a certificate or license to work in the field. Rules and regulations change from region to region, so make sure that you check with local governing boards to find out what you need to get started in the business. While you don't necessarily need a certification, many groomers choose to get one.

Possessing a certificate means that you have undergone formal dog grooming training. A certification demonstrates to clients and employers that you have a strong knowledge of current grooming techniques, understand best safety practices when handling dogs, and that you've learned the theory behind grooming and know how to apply it in practical settings.



While there are many pros to getting certified, some find that getting a certification may not be the best option for them.

Here are some pros and cons you should take into consideration:





Con: Diverts Focus

How do I get certified?

If you've decided to get certified, the first thing you should do is buckle down and do some research to find a program that suits your needs.

For example, if you're...

- Tight on a budget, then you'll need a relatively inexpensive option
- Aren't able to travel far distances, then you'll need one that is close to home or doesn't require you to leave your house (online distance learning)
- Working full time, then you'll need a flexible program to fit in with your busy schedule

While there are no governmental education requirements or programs for dog groomers, there are federally registered national associations and certification programs worth looking into.

Some organizations don't offer their own dog grooming training but exist as networks for professional groomers who have been tested against a common standard. When you register for their certification tests, they expect that you have already had training elsewhere and want to pursue further certification from these national associations.

While obtaining these certifications and association membership is optional, it's a great idea! You'll have access to the previously mentioned membership benefits, and additional certifications show that you're passionate and credible with a drive to learn and be great at what you do.

Getting a certification isn't easy, but once you're done, it doesn't mean that it's smooth sailing from then on! Don't assume that the certification is a shortcut to success or a guarantee of employment! It takes a lot of time, resources, dedication, and passion to get your business off the ground.
